## **Austin Weekly Deal Highlights**

Happy St. Paddy's Day! Get yourself a green beer(s) and push that SXSW hangover out one more day! This week in Austin deal activity, we saw **Digital Pharmacist** sell for a whopping \$125M! Shout out to **Chris Loughlin** and the hardworking team over there. Of course I'm going to plug **LiveOak Venture Partners**, who were investors since the Series A in 2015.

### **Austin Financing Activity**

- <u>CesiumAstro</u>, a company building advanced antennas and communications systems for satellites, <u>raised</u> a \$12.4M Series A led by
   Airbus Ventures, which also included Kleiner Perkins, Franklin Templeton Venture Fund, and Lavrock Ventures. The
   company last raised a \$1.75M seed round in 2017.
- Waldo Photos, an Al-powered photo-finding platform, <u>raised</u> a \$4M fundraising round led by St. Louis-based Lewis & Clark
   Ventures. Existing investors Upfront Ventures and Geekdom Fund also participated in the round.
- <u>Prism</u>, a talent buying and venue management software for the music industry, <u>raised</u> \$2.2M from angel investors including Kip
   McClanahan, Mario Fighali, Bill Babel, and Jay Jensen.
- StoryFit, a data-driven platform designed for decision making throughout a story's life-cycle, <u>raised</u> \$1.75M in new funding, led by New York-based ff Venture Capital. Bertelsmann Digital Media Investments, Ascend Venture Capital, Techstars, Capital
   Factory and Walter A. Winshall also participated in the round.

#### **Austin M&A Activity**

<u>Digital Pharmacist</u>, a SaaS platform to connect independent pharmacies with their patients, was <u>acquired</u> by Los Angeles-based K1
 Investment Management, for \$125M. The company raised almost \$14M from investors including <u>LiveOak Venture Partners</u> and <u>Activate Venture Partners</u>.

#### Other Regional and Relevant Deal Activity

- Adthena, a developer of artificial intelligence-backed search marketing and analytics software, which has its U.S. office in Austin,
   raised \$14M in a Series A funding round. The company announced Austin as its U.S. headquarters a year ago and will continue to hire locally with the new capital.
- <u>Geoforce</u>, a Plano-based asset tracking platform for field operations, raised \$3M of venture funding from undisclosed investors, per Pitchbook. The company has raised approx. \$19M to date.

RandomTrees, a Houston-based provider of enterprise AI solutions, received an undisclosed sum of financing from Mouri Tech.
