So all of that to say, we got another one. This week **Tesla** announced they are moving their headquarters here. In the past 24 months we've seen **Oracle, Apple's** HQ2, **Samsung's** \$17B plant, and Rocket Man himself. Who's next?

Austin Weekly Deal Activity

- Volcon, an electric dirt bike and ATV manufacturer, <u>completed its IPO</u>, debuting on the Nasdaq under the ticker VLCN, in which they sold about 3M shares raising approx. \$16.6M. Shares initially soared from the opening price of \$5.50 to \$14.30 and are currently at \$9.13.
- Olea Edge Analytics, an Al monitoring, billing, and insights company for city water systems, announced a \$35M Series C round, led by Insight Partners, and have raised a total of \$50.6M with investors including Renewal Funds and Mercury Fund.

- <u>SigmaSense</u>, a fully-scalable sensing technology firm, announced a \$24M Series B, a year
 after their \$22M round that was led by <u>Foxconn Technology Group</u>, and included <u>Corning</u>,
 and <u>Elnk</u>.
- Alpha Paw, a pet wellness company, has raised an \$8M Series A round, led by Nordic Eye and including Neal Dempsey of BayPartners.
- <u>Assembly</u>, a virtual culinary experiences company, has raised a <u>seed round of \$1.75M</u> led by <u>Wilshire Lane Partners</u> and <u>Acrew Capital</u>.
- <u>Creaton</u>, a decentralized content material administration and sharing platform, raised \$1.1M of venture funding from BTSE and Tykhe Block Ventures

Austin M&A Activity

- FloSports, a sports video-streaming company, <u>acquired HockeyTech Inc.</u>, for the company's hockey streaming platform and statistics software. FloSports has raised \$79.4M with investors including Discovery, WWE, BDMI, DCM Ventures, and Causeway Media Partners.
- Raptor Technologies, a Houston and Austin-based student safety platform, received an
 undisclosed amount of development capital from JMI Equity, Thoma Bravo and Ares Capital
 Corporation BDC. As part of the financing, Raptor acquired U.K.-based software firm CPOMS,
 which develops an online system to safeguard students and improve student outcomes by
 documenting incidents of abuse, cyberbullying and other issues.
- Fourth, a restaurant workforce and inventory company, has <u>acquired both</u> <u>PeopleMatter</u> and Hiring Manager from <u>Snagajob</u>, with backing from <u>Marlin Equity Partners</u>. Fourth has previous venture funding from <u>Insight Partners</u> and <u>ECI Partners</u>.
- <u>Stylust</u>, a digital shopping platform, was acquired by **Wizard Commerce** for an undisclosed amount.

Other Texas Deal Activity

- <u>BlackBoxStocks</u>, a Dallas-based stock analytics SaaS platform, has <u>filed to go public</u> on the Nasdag, under the ticker BLBX, seeking to raise \$20M.
- Solo Brands, a Southlake, Texas-based maker of branded fire pits and camp stoves, filed for an IPO. It plans to list on the NYSE (DTC) and reports \$42M of net income on \$158M in revenue for the first half of 2021. Shareholders include Summit Partners.
- Cypress Growth Capital, a Dallas-based financing firm, has closed a \$50M fourth fund with which they've made their <u>first investment of \$2.8M</u> to <u>Vision2 Systems</u>, a church management platform.
- Otto, a Dallas-based fintech mobile platform, <u>raised a \$4.5M seed round</u> led by <u>Uncommon</u>
 Capital, including <u>Pelion Venture Partners</u> and <u>Mark Cuban</u>.
- <u>Allied Bioscience</u>, a Plano-based antimicrobial coating biotech company, reported raising \$600K in debt, equity, and other options via six investors.
- <u>DocJuris</u>, a Houston-based a contract negotiation platform, raised <u>\$2.15M</u> of venture funding from undisclosed investors

 Morpheus Ventures, Ericsson Ventures, and GM Ventures.



- The average monthly rent in Austin is now \$1,500. Prices are rising at the fastest pace ever
